



Performance Highlights¹ for Indiana

2003-2004

EDUCATION

(2 subgrantees reporting)

8,314 students in grades 1-12 were tutored.

346 students received mentoring or counseling concerning school success or achievement.

ENVIRONMENT

(1 subgrantee reporting)

722 acres of public lands and habitat were restored or conserved.

400 trees were planted in urban communities.

2,079 students were engaged in service-learning and community education activities organized by members.

HUMAN NEEDS

(4 subgrantees reporting)

142 people were counseled concerning job development or placement.

90 homes were constructed, benefiting 423 low-income or elderly residents.

1,632 people were provided health care screening and referral to follow-up care.

PUBLIC SAFETY

(2 subgrantees reporting)

283 young ex-offenders participated in the Mentor Corps program organized and conducted by members.

COMMUNITY STRENGTHENING

(9 subgrantees reporting)

1,152 people received information regarding community services.

VOLUNTEER LEVERAGING

(9 subgrantees reporting)

1,761 volunteers were recruited for tutoring or other educational purposes.

516 volunteers were recruited for assistance in addressing human needs.

MEMBER DEVELOPMENT

(8 subgrantees reporting)

49 members were trained in CPR, first aid, and emergency response.

108 members received training in technical skills related to carrying out their assignments.

EDUCATION

(7 subgrantees reporting)

6,339 students participated in school sports and violence avoidance activities that were organized by members.

4,889 students in grades 1-12 were tutored.

186 students were counseled concerning school success or achievement.

ENVIRONMENT

(1 subgrantee reporting)

952 acres of public lands and habitat were restored.

11,547 pounds of trash were removed from neighborhoods, benefiting 50,000 people.

HUMAN NEEDS

(5 subgrantees reporting)

2,945 people's support needs were assessed or identified.

2,894 people were provided case management for health appointments or follow-up scheduling.

394 individuals were counseled concerning job development or placement.

97 housing units were constructed, benefiting 440 elderly or disabled low-income residents.

PUBLIC SAFETY

(2 subgrantees reporting)

1,513 juvenile offenders were mentored through a pre-release program.

8,875 students, adults, or families were trained in 184 conflict mediation/resolution programs that were conducted by members.

COMMUNITY STRENGTHENING

(9 subgrantees reporting)

11,092 people benefited from community events and fairs focusing on health or other human needs issues.

VOLUNTEER LEVERAGING

(9 subgrantees reporting)

2,659 volunteers were recruited for tutoring and other educational purposes.

6,512 volunteers were recruited for assistance in addressing a range of human needs.

MEMBER DEVELOPMENT

(6 subgrantees reporting)

205 members were trained in life skills such as organizational skills, problem solving, leadership, and conflict resolution.

Data Source: All data are aggregates of the data subgrantees report in the AmeriCorps Progress Reports. State Commissions review subgrantees' reports, and then submit approved information to AmeriCorps through the Grantee Progress Reports (GPR). AmeriCorps programs vary in their start and end dates, and not all programs operate during the same timeframe. During any given year the time period of activity reported is between October 1st through September 30th. Any program activity that may have occurred after September 30, 2005 is not captured in this report.







AmeriCorps State Members Serving in Indiana Counties: 2004-05





AmeriCorps State Education Award Usage: 1994-2002¹



Education Award. After successfully completing a term of service, AmeriCorps members who are enrolled in the National Service Trust are eligible to receive an education award. The education award can be used to pay education costs at qualified institutions of higher education or training, or to repay qualified student loans. The award currently is \$4,725 for a year of full-time service, with correspondingly lesser awards for half-time and reduced half-time service. A member has up to seven years after his or her term of service has ended to use the award.

Education Award Usage. Education award usage is generated from eSpan. For education award usage rates, we examined awards in which members had 3 or more years to access the award. This decision was based on evidence that most members use the education award within 3 years of earning it.

¹ For education award usage rates, we examined awards in which members have had three or more years to access the award. This decision was based on evidence that most members use the education award within three years of earning it.

For this report, we have identified members who served in 1994-1995 through 2001-2002 to examine usage rates for education awards.

1994-1995 through 1997-1998: Members who served in 1994-1995 through 1997-1998 have completed their seven-year education award eligibility period; because the eligibility period for using the education award is completed, we have aggregated the usage rate for these members.

1998-1999 through 2001-2002: Members who served in 1998-1999 through 2001-2002 have at least one year of eligibility left. As former members of these years access their education awards, these data will fluctuate as the awards remain active.

We will continue to track AmeriCorps member education award usage by year, adding an additional year in the “eligibility remaining” portion of the graph. Usage rates may differ from year to year as more earned education award money is withdrawn from members’ Trust accounts. As members end their seven-year period of eligibility they will be added to the “eligibility completed” group.
