



**Performance Highlights<sup>1</sup> for Michigan**

**2003-2004**

**EDUCATION**

(8 subgrantees reporting)  
 841 students in grades 1-12 received tutoring.  
 12 in-class enrichment sessions were provided featuring speakers or presentations, benefiting 917 students.  
 7,703 students were mentored or counseled regarding school success or achievement.

**ENVIRONMENT**

(1 subgrantee reporting)  
 32,713 individuals received information about risks of groundwater contamination.  
 7,680 groundwater risk assessments were completed.

**HUMAN NEEDS**

(4 subgrantees reporting)  
 2,496 people received counseling related to health and family matters.  
 66 low-income housing units were constructed for 284 disabled or elderly individuals.  
 766 new or potential homeowners received housing services and loan development assistance.

**PUBLIC SAFETY**

(1 subgrantee reporting)  
 2,295 students benefited from conflict mediation/resolution training in schools.  
 850 individuals received counseling in substance abuse prevention or related issues.

**COMMUNITY STRENGTHENING**

(13 subgrantees reporting)  
 6,228 individuals benefited from services such as mentoring, homework assistance, or community service projects.

**VOLUNTEER LEVERAGING**

(13 subgrantees reporting)  
 5,189 volunteers were recruited for tutoring and other educational purposes.  
 2,719 volunteers were recruited to assist in addressing human needs issues.

**MEMBER DEVELOPMENT**

(13 subgrantees reporting)  
 46 members were trained in technical skills related to carrying out their assignments.  
 92 members were trained in life skills, such as organizational skills, problem solving, teamwork, and leadership.

**EDUCATION**

(12 subgrantees reporting)  
 2,352 students in grades 1-12 received tutoring.  
 5,858 students were mentored or counseled regarding school success or achievement.  
 682 students in Head Start or kindergarten received instruction.

**ENVIRONMENT**

(1 subgrantee reporting)  
 24,703 students received information about risks of groundwater contamination.  
 20,522 groundwater risk assessments were completed for residences and businesses.

**HUMAN NEEDS**

(6 subgrantees reporting)  
 7,000 books were assembled and distributed for a book drive.  
 2,259 people received counseling related to health and family matters.  
 470 new or potential homeowners received housing services and loan development assistance.  
 78 low-income housing units were constructed for 335 disabled or elderly individuals.

**PUBLIC SAFETY**

(1 subgrantee reporting)  
 1,745 students benefited from violence prevention training in schools.

**COMMUNITY STRENGTHENING**

(19 subgrantees reporting)  
 176 families were provided child care in support of other human service activities.  
 Members worked with more than 60 organizations to strengthen practices for enlisting volunteers.

**VOLUNTEER LEVERAGING**

(19 subgrantees reporting)  
 25,307 volunteers were recruited for tutoring and other educational purposes.  
 17,509 volunteers were recruited to assist in addressing human needs issues.

**MEMBER DEVELOPMENT**

(19 subgrantees reporting)  
 716 members were trained in citizenship and civic responsibility.

Data Source: All data are aggregates of the data subgrantees report in the AmeriCorps Progress Reports. State Commissions review subgrantees' reports, and then submit approved information to AmeriCorps through the Grantee Progress Reports (GPR). AmeriCorps programs vary in their start and end dates, and not all programs operate during the same timeframe. During any given year the time period of activity reported is between October 1st through September 30th. Any program activity that may have occurred after September 30, 2005 is not captured in this report.







**AmeriCorps State Members Serving in Michigan Counties: 2004-05**





**AmeriCorps State Education Award Usage: 1994-2002<sup>1</sup>**



**Education Award.** After successfully completing a term of service, AmeriCorps members who are enrolled in the National Service Trust are eligible to receive an education award. The education award can be used to pay education costs at qualified institutions of higher education or training, or to repay qualified student loans. The award currently is \$4,725 for a year of full-time service, with correspondingly lesser awards for half-time and reduced half-time service. A member has up to seven years after his or her term of service has ended to use the award.

**Education Award Usage.** Education award usage is generated from eSpan. For education award usage rates, we examined awards in which members had 3 or more years to access the award. This decision was based on evidence that most members use the education award within 3 years of earning it.

For this report, we have identified members who served in 1994-1995 through 2001-2002 to examine usage rates for education awards.

**1994-1995 through 1997-1998:** Members who served in 1994-1995 through 1997-1998 have completed their seven-year education award eligibility period; because the eligibility period for using the education award is completed, we have aggregated the usage rate for these members.

**1998-1999 through 2001-2002:** Members who served in 1998-1999 through 2001-2002 have at least one year of eligibility left. As former members of these years access their education awards, these data will fluctuate as the awards remain active.

We will continue to track AmeriCorps member education award usage by year, adding an additional year in the “eligibility remaining” portion of the graph. Usage rates may differ from year to year as more earned education award money is withdrawn from members’ Trust accounts. As members end their seven-year period of eligibility they will be added to the “eligibility completed” group.
