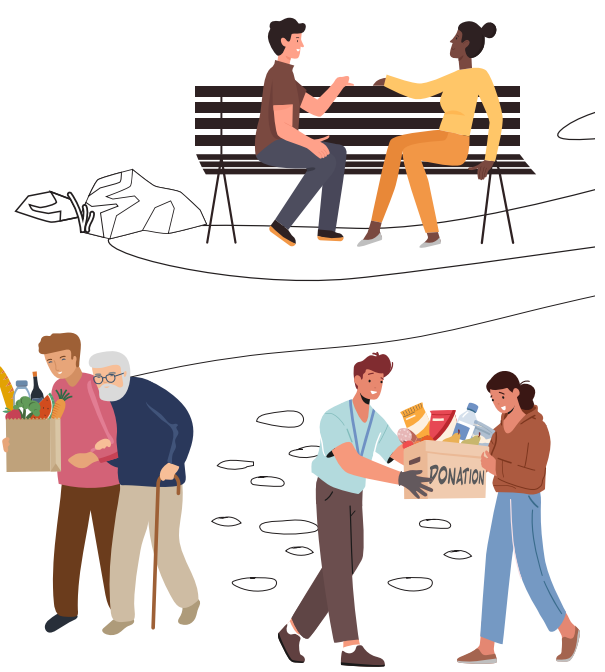
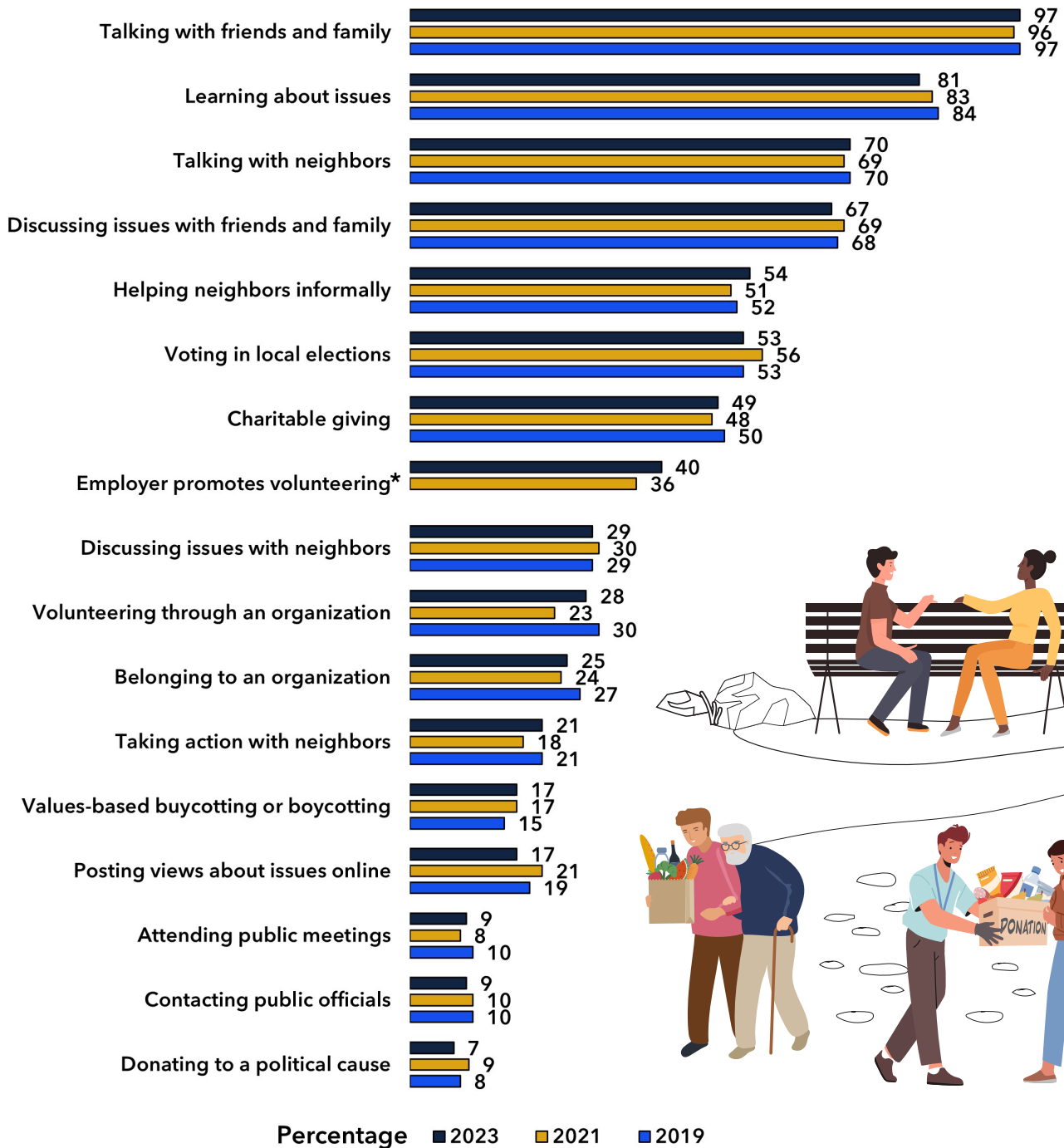


# National Rates of Civic Engagement from 2019 to 2023

The Current Population Survey Civic Engagement and Volunteering (CEV) Supplement is the most robust longitudinal survey about volunteerism and other forms of [civic engagement](#) in the United States. Produced through a partnership between AmeriCorps and the U.S. Census Bureau, the CEV takes the pulse of our nation's civic health every two years.

**About These Figures:** Rates reflect the estimated share of Americans who engaged in each civic activity at least once in the past year. Following historical U.S. Census Bureau practice, formal volunteering rates are calculated as the estimated share of volunteers in the population over the estimated total civilian noninstitutional population.
