MEETING COMMUNITY NEEDS IN LOUISIANA

More than 5,700 people of all ages and backgrounds are helping to meet local needs, strengthen communities, and increase civic engagement through national service in Louisiana. Serving at more than 530 locations throughout the state, these citizens tutor and mentor children, support veterans and military families, provide health services, restore the environment, respond to disasters, increase economic opportunity, and recruit and manage volunteers.

This year, the Corporation for National and Community Service (CNCS) will commit more than \$18,840,000 to support Louisiana communities through national service initiatives. CNCS invests in cost-effective community solutions--working hand in hand with local partners to improve lives, expand economic opportunity, and engage citizens in solving problems in their communities. Serving in many of the state's most impoverished communities, CNCS provides vital support to schools, food banks, homeless shelters, community health clinics, youth centers, veterans service facilities, and other nonprofit and faith-based organizations at a time of growing demand for services. Through a unique public-private partnership, this federal investment will leverage an additional \$7,270,000 in other resources to strengthen community impact, build local support, and increase return on taxpayer dollars.

AmeriCorps: This year AmeriCorps will provide more than 1,400 individuals the opportunity to provide intensive, results-driven service to meet education, environmental, health, economic, and other pressing needs in communities across Louisiana. Most AmeriCorps grant funding goes to the Volunteer Louisiana Commission, which in turn awards grants to nonprofit groups to respond to local needs. Most of the remainder of the grant funding is distributed by CNCS directly to multi-state and national organizations through a competitive grants process. Other individuals serve through AmeriCorps VISTA, whose members help bring individuals and communities out of poverty by serving full-time to fight illiteracy, improve health services, create businesses, and increase housing opportunities, and AmeriCorps NCCC (National Civilian Community Corps), a 10-month, full time residential program for men and women between the ages of 18 and 24. In exchange for their service, AmeriCorps members earn an education award that can be used to pay for college or to pay back qualified student loans. Since 1994, more than 12,000 Louisiana residents have served more than 15 million hours and have qualified for Segal AmeriCorps Education Awards totaling more than \$30,170,000.

Senior Corps: More than 4,300 seniors in Louisiana contribute their time and talents in one of three Senior Corps programs. Foster Grandparents serve one-on-one as tutors and mentors to more than 2,600 young people who have special needs. Senior Companions help more than 380 homebound seniors and other adults maintain independence in their own homes. RSVP volunteers conduct safety patrols, renovate homes, protect the environment, tutor and mentor youth, respond to natural disasters, and provide other services through more than 150 groups across Louisiana.

Social Innovation Fund: The Social Innovation Fund transforms lives and communities using limited federal investment as a catalyst to grow the impact of nonprofits with evidence of strong results. It harnesses the expertise of grantmaking intermediaries to identify, evaluate and expand effective nonprofits and engages funding partners to contribute nearly three dollars to every one federal dollar invested. As the Social Innovation Fund network grows programs that work in Louisiana, more people are able to overcome their most pressing challenges in the areas of economic opportunity, health, and youth development. The Social Innovation Fund is investing \$330,000 in expanding the impact of 3 nonprofits in Louisiana.

The Corporation for National and Community Service is a federal agency that improves lives, strengthens communities, and fosters civic engagement through service and volunteering. CNCS annually engages more than five million Americans in service to meet local needs through Senior Corps, AmeriCorps, and national days of service; improves communities through the Social Innovation Fund, and leads President Obama's national call to service initiative, United We Serve. The award can be used in any state to pay for college, graduate school, vocational training, or to pay back student loans. The education award total is included in total CNCS funding.
- AmeriCorps National figures may include national programs headquartered in the state and/or operating sites of national programs that are headquartered in other states. Funding reflects the estimated proportionate share of the national grant associated with operating sites in this report. Some national organizations do not report operating site data, or it was not available at time of publishing, so figures may not reflect current conditions.
- The service location total may contain multiple counts of unique locations where multiple CNCS programs are operating.
- As part of its public-private partnership approach, CNCS requires grantees to leverage additional resources to strengthen community impact and increase the return on the federal investment. This figure reflects non-CNCS cash and in-kind resources that CNCS grantees and project sponsors have committed to raise to support their programming activities across the state.

National Service Impact in Louisiana



AmeriCorps

Project Homecoming builds housing units for vulnerable, low-income families in New Orleans. Launched in 2007 as a Presbytery of South Louisiana disaster recovery ministry in the aftermath of Hurricane Katrina, Project Homecoming has rebuilt 130 homes for low-income, elderly, disabled, and underinsured clients. Project Homecoming first operated as a placement site for AmeriCorps NCCC teams and as a host site for another AmeriCorps State program, Louisiana Delta Service Corps. They are now an independent nonprofit community development organization, and are moving toward expanding services to include building amenities such as gardens and playgrounds.

AmeriCorps NCCC

AmeriCorps NCCC team River 7 worked with Green Light New Orleans to install 8,950 compact fluorescent lamps in 450 houses. The total energy bill savings for recipients was approximately \$411,700. The team also led 1,600 volunteers in installing rain barrels, clearing 39 lots, and installing community gardens. The team shared information with the community that they hope will lead to a more sustainable New Orleans. Team members learned how to help save money and protect the environment by curtailing energy usage.

AmeriCorps VISTA

In 2013, Louisiana Court Appointed Special Advocates for Children (CASA) and local CASA and Children's Advocacy Centers programs hosted approximately 20 AmeriCorps VISTA members. During that time, the project was expanded to include two smaller, more rural areas of Louisiana, Saint Landry and Vernon parishes, where VISTA members used social media platforms to increase volunteer recruitment. Jefferson and New Orleans VISTA members facilitated the Darkness to Light training and educated community members on how they can best assist child abuse prevention efforts. A New Orleans CASA member secured funds to launch an in-house Advocate Resource Library to help raise awareness of issues facing youth in foster care. Additionally, members serving in the Louisiana Court Appointed Special Advocates for Children office were integral in developing the initial framework for the Geaux Blue for Kids! prevention initiative, launched in April 2013.

Senior Corps

RSVP in Lincoln Parish has 30 RSVP volunteers tutoring 120 teacher-identified elementary students in science comprehension and math skills. Tutoring incorporates hands-on science and math projects that help increase interest in these subjects. The volunteer's goal is to increase the number of students who pass the LEAP test and enhance enthusiasm for science and math. The RSVP volunteers helped students increase their LEAP scores by 5 percent (74 percent in 2011 vs. 79 percent in 2012). A teacher evaluation of the program also showed improved classroom grades and student behavior.

Social Innovation Fund

By partnering with a Social Innovation Fund intermediary, Jobs for the Future, the National Fund for Workforce Solutions (NFWS) is expanding its targeted training and technical assistance to at least 23,000 low-income individuals and addressing the critical skill needs of more than 1,000 employers. In Louisiana, the Fund is working with two nonprofit collaborators: New Orleans Works/Greater New Orleans Foundation and Workforce Innovations in Northwest Louisiana (WINLA)/Community Foundation of North Louisiana. Each of these received an initial subgrant of \$300,000 over two years from Jobs for the Future, which they will match dollar-for-dollar with nonfederal funds. New Orleans Works plans to serve 250 jobseekers in career ladder jobs such as health information management and laboratory technology; the organization will also serve 70 incumbent workers. WINLA is expanding its existing workforce partnership in health care and creating a new partnership in the energy sector. It plans to serve 150 job seekers and 198 incumbent workers.
